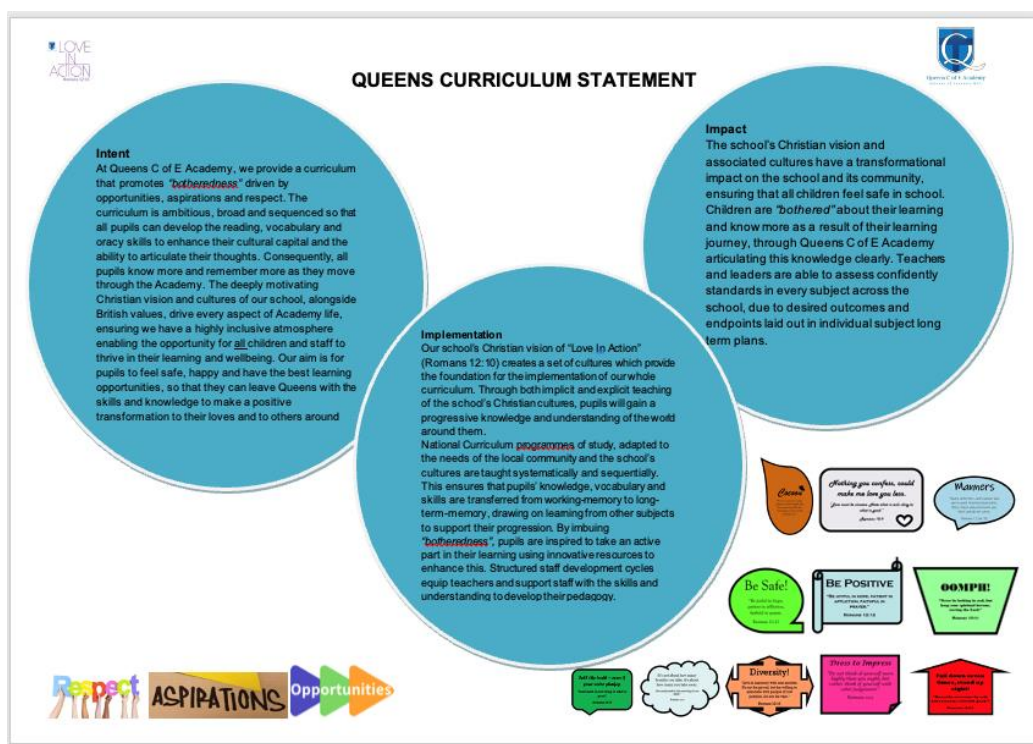

Introduction:

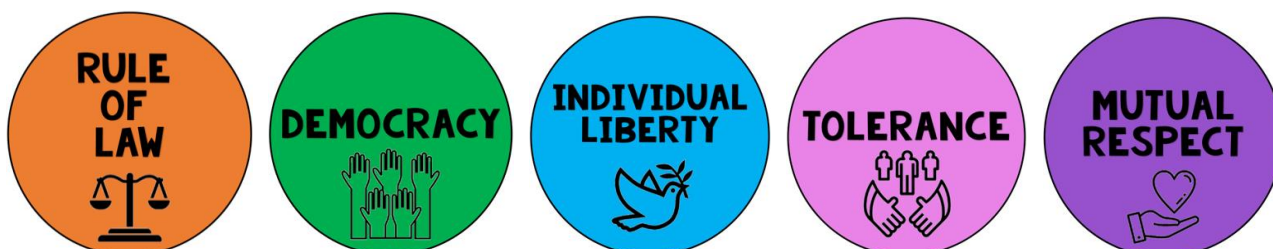
At Queens C of E Academy, we want our children immersed in a culture which upholds and explicitly teaches and reinforces these values.

The British Values are:

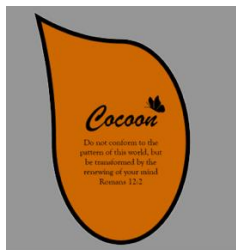
- **Rule of Law**

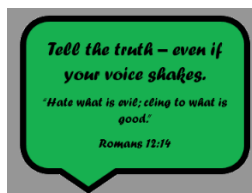

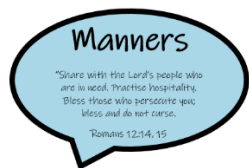
